

#### Saying Good-bye to a dear friend

Bill and I put Jenna peacefully to sleep February 6th 2022. We had a vet come to the house.

When we got Jenna I had not planned on having another Dobe. Devon had died at only 7 due to his heart. It had been a month and Bill and I were so lonely without him.

Andy who has been responsible for several of my Dobes said there is an older female that needs a foster and we could do that. Bill and I agreed. We would have a dog in the house again and we were not obligated to keep her.

The day Jenna was dropped off she had a dental. She was supposed to be spayed but her teeth were so bad she had been under to long so they could not get to it. She had a bad hernia that the vets didn't know if it was a mammary tumor. They also realized she was chipped. She was 8 years old and not 6 as we had been told. I said 8 was fine. Jenna had also had too many puppies with nipples that really hung down. If you looked at her from the back her hernia looked like she had testicles. She was a mess. Bill wanted to keep her and said who else would take her if we didn't. I wasn't as convinced as I could tell she didn't like other animals and wasn't all that fond of people in addition to some substantial prey drive for a dog her age. But Bill said you can work with her and Jenna knowing she needed to convince me was a big time suck up to mom.

Jenna was down for almost 2 months with her hernia and spay recovery, limited activity. By then it was the holidays and winter. I didn't start working with her until the following spring. She got her CGC at my small dog club. I knew she needed more work before she was ready to come to Glenbard. I took her to a summer class with Roc Solid. It ended up being outside and there were only six of us. It was good for Jenna. We were able to start at Glenbard the end of summer. Speaking with Karen about Jenna's issues she welcomed us into her Novice class. Did I mention the Doberman National was at Pheasant Run in October of that year? I had to enter her. As long as I was at it let's do Rally. I also spoke to Mary Therese and we were a go for Rally.





In the beginning of Jenna's training I had given Bill the leash to work with her. She wasn't to cooperative so he handed me back the leash and said you have to do it.

At Fox Valley's trial when Jenna got her CD I had forgotten her choke collar. A friend of mine from my other dog club was there showing her dog and had an extra one which she let me borrow. I had returned it and we were sticking around for a picture. I believe Bill went to the car to get his phone and took Jenna with him. Jenna was in a pretty fall clippie collar. They went out the back door by the food. For some reason I walked down the hallway and went out the regular door. They did not see me and came back in the way they went out. Even though Jenna was only 65 pounds when she didn't see mom she pulled Bill down to his knees and backed out of her collar and was headed down the hallway to find mom. Someone got her and made sure Bill was all right as I was coming back down the hallway. Jenna saw me and then everything was right with the world again.

During the pandemic I decided we all needed to get out the of house and get some exercise so I told Bill we were going to walk Jenna. For the first 3 times Bill took Jenna and I followed along. By the fourth time out I was ready to go it alone. Jenna in one hand and my cane in the other we were off.

We walked almost every day from that summer on. We had to cut back during the winter but still got out as much as possible. In the spring last year I tore my meniscus and was down for 3 months. By the time I could resume our walks Jenna had started her decline. I thought I was going to lose her over the 4th of July. I had spent a morning before that weekend on the phone to see what vet would be available to come to the house. My first choice was going out of town. The weekend came and went and Jenna was not ready to leave. Seven months later Jenna looked at me and I knew she was ready and so did Bill. When I called my first choice she couldn't believe Jenna was still with us.

Bill said she hung on as long as she did for me. She was not ready to leave mom.


Jenna ended up with 8 titles. I was grateful that Bill came to every show with us and helped me with Jenna. She was a dog that occasionally liked to remind other dogs that she didn't need any more friends. In the end she became much more accepting of other dogs and co existed very nicely with our two cats. She really liked our red boy Jake.

It's amazing how some determined and consistent training can greatly change a dog's life for the better.



As a crazy woman who has taken on three TOTALLY different dogs and going back to teaching novice again, I have reinforced in my mind that attitude and energy can really make a difference. Lets take the pack of three for example.

Blue- ACD: needing a strong leader presence. No touch, no reward, all work to get him to perform. The reward is the work, not the treat. Be my leader or I'll consider you weak! Move it as fast as you can in heeling or he'll herd you like cattle and he means it (even in retirement- darn heeler)!!!

Mars- Border Collie: quiet, low energy feedback to him. Quiet praise. Touch him in the ring too much or get excited on a job well done and he turns into an over excited mess of crying and jumping, just THRILLED to be working and so excited that he can't stand it. Slower pace in heeling so he stays focused on the job.

Windy- Rottweiler: Love me, love me! Hugs and kisses. Give he high energy, smiles, reassurance, charge me up! Pet me, put spring in your step, tell me I'm good! (better yet what she is thinking "Where the heck is that hot dog, Lady or I'll go dull as a butter knife!") Pour in every ounce of energy into her and she'll reflect it back. However, a well timed verbal correction to set her back on path is always a great leadership reset!

I see this in students today, some giving low energy back to their dog and not getting what they would like as that is what their past dog needed or some too high energy and their dog not responding. Some not providing the leader presence that their dog is craving. Each one is working on it and getting better ever day but it is HARD; reinventing yourself and acting different in the ring and in training.

Keep this in mind as you take a new journey with a new puppy- might not be the same as your past dog or if you are not achieving your goals and don't know why, try adjusting your attitude and energy level and see where this leads!

#### Glenbard membership Zoom meeting Wednesday February 9th 2022

Meeting called to order 7:35 PM by Joan President

Members present Chuck Holtzen, Karen Schlipf. Liz Hixon, Laura Setar, Gerry Bara, Gail Meyers, Pat & John Senne, Nikki Kuhlman, Grace Wisniewski, Susan Wooden, Kathy Bianchetti, Joan Mazat, Shawn Hacker, Annie Kane, Bette McMillan, Sandi Stephenson, Candy Ellis, and Carole Moen.

Joan read the minutes from the Nov 17th meeting 2021.

Carole wanted added that she had asked which board member would be filling Ed last year before Sandi asked if anyone had talked to Ed.

Carole also wanted added that she had mentioned a gift basket for Jim McGuire and a gift card had been suggested too.

Joan asked if Carole wanted the additions put in the newsletter and Carole said that should not be necessary.

Bette motioned to accept the minutes with additions, Pat seconded.

Secretary report: none

**VP report – Membership**: Karen stated 57 members renewed with 21 of them being lifetime. .

**Treasurer's report:** Shawn stated the Jan 2022 Agility trial profited \$2,237.00 Our expenses were \$7,508.49. Entry fees and the additional judge's expenses paid by the Brittany Club were \$9,745.49 leaving us with a profit.

Shawn informed the membership that we have a new contract with the fairgrounds. Our rent has increased to \$5,150 quarterly from \$4,900 which now needs to be paid at the beginning of the quarter rather than the end.

We had a negative \$1,465.73 net income from 12-1-21 to 2-9-22. Shawn explained that we paid last quarter rent and then had to also pay first quarter rent for 2022.

Our accounts are \$50,241.84, second account \$20,613.94 and our checking account with the credit card is \$2,613.94 for a grand total of \$73,213.16

We need a second signer on the checking account. Karen Schlipf was suggested and she said yes. Membership vote was unanimous to accept her.

**DOT report**: Liz stated that classes were off for a month because of Covid but were back now with only losing two students and not because of Covid.

One was Karen Schwartz with her dog Joe because of hip dysplasia.

George Guzman never came back.

Liz has been in the Puppy class. Lori's husband has some health issues so she has not been available. Liz stated Nikki could use some help.

Karen has a dog that might be fear bitter in class. Liz is suggesting the dog should not be at Glenbard. It needs some one on one that we don't have the time to address.

Liz stated we have plenty of room on Tuesday nights for train on your own.



Liz wants to have pool of people that could volunteer to instructor if someone gets sick or can't make it.

Bette asked what the requirements were for being a substitute and which classes. Liz said to specify what class you are interested in.

Bette asked if there is an Open class. Liz said yes on Tuesday but no one is signing up. Sandi is there and available.

**Registrar report:** Joan thanked Pat for taking on the job. Chuck said she is going over things with Pat and helping her. The website now matches the calendar.

Liz added you can now sign up online for the match.

She left the fee the same as in the fall. \$8 first run and \$6 second run. Match is March 1st.

Liz has next match dates on the website.

**Awards**: Candy wanted to confirm that there were no requirements for 2021 awards. You only had to do one thing, something, anything to help the club.

Candy is going to be the new awards person.

The awards dinner will be at the picnic this year so we can be outside. No dinner at a restaurant.

Annie volunteered to help. Joan said Annie had a beautiful Aussie.

**Agility trial**: Bette stated we had more than enough club members present at our 2 day trial. AKC requires 5 members be present.

The next agility trial is the first weekend in June at the Farm.

Pat suggested Bette write an article for Barks for Agility. Betty said Donna E wanted to do it. Joan said she had talked to Donna

**Obedience & Rally trials**: Pat, Liz and Joan will be co-chairs for this year's trial. Pat has judges and has sent them contracts for the weekend but without assignments. Suzanne Hemminger, Shirley Spall from Indiana and Dr Hallie Ray from Wisconsin.

What do we want to do this year? Same format as 2021 or change?

Long discussion.

Carole suggested 2 days two trials per day with 2 rings and two judges.

Gail said she does two trials per day with 2 judges for Lyons. Carole asked to clarify that she only has two rings and each judge does an entire trial. Gail said yes. Carole agreed 100% that is the way to go.

Car-Dun-Al had a lot of entries. Lyons is using Stone City. Space was brought up that these clubs only had room for two rings.

Carole mentioned the 30 days 100 mile rule for judges will go back into effect the end of June this year. Asked to explain. A judge cannot judge the same class in 30 days unless it is over 100 miles away. Gail reiterated having a judge do an entire trial is easier than assigning classes.

Grace & Lennox got their Star Puppy in December 2021.


Annie's dog got cleared from vet so she can come back for training.










#### **GABOC Agility**
