Windy's Mom took a break from high pressure frequent training for the human puppy's baseball season in June. Was this a good thing or a bad thing? Ponderous!

Mar's "put me in coach" and gotta work attitude does not fit with boring days of no learning. So we channeled the energy into really good early morning walks/sundown walks and making sure there was plenty of play time. Morning sprints in the yard have been important for him! Hair blowing in the wind like "Fabio" on a romance book cover! What an adjustment for a Rottie lady! Next steps for Mars: maturity to get him out to odd places asking for the focus and dealing with distractions while he works on signals. Caveltti work at the walk and then at the trot to work on foot placement and body awareness. We will start at the bars 4" high at 20" wide with a goal of 22" wide. We have done this in the past with Windy and it really helps with gait extension and paying attention to oneself/how to use the body. Mars has a lot to learn and do for sure.



Windy- even though she has accomplished more than I can ever have asked for, there is still much to do. Her more relaxed training schedule has led to changes. Windy is a foodie. Loves food. Works for food. Windy also has been known to be a creeper on the signals and as a victim of "I love her too much to correct her years ago", this can lead to point deductions. Changes in our training have included NO food in the ring until all the exercises are finished and then JACKPOT of treats. Second thing I have changed is my signal. Using a flat palm facing her moving my arm forward instead of a "windmill" motion to give the impression of "Halt- Do NOT move forward!" has greatly improved signals and command descrimination in my view on both the down and the sit. She has responded well. Something to keep in mind- if you are not happy with the performance of an exercise, think about what you are looking for and how to assist your partner in making those tweaks to get the outcome you

desire. She will be six in September and we are still learning together as a team.

Windy and Mars will be back in the ring in August. We hope to report back if the time off and little less weekly work with these adjustments to the program will result in green ribbons at the trials.



FIRST AID TIPS

While human first aid kits are typically sufficient, they may not have everything that you need specifically tailored for your dog.

- A fresh, unexpired bottle of 3% hydrogen peroxide. This isn't only for cleaning wounds but rather for inducing vomiting if your dog gets into something poisonous! Accidental poisonings in our pets occur thousands of times a day across the world, so you always want to be prepared to induce vomiting if necessary. That said, never induce vomiting without consulting your veterinarian or an animal poison control center first, as sometimes it can make your pet worse. Usually 1 3 Tablespoons for a Doberman...no more. Also comes in handy for bathing after skunk spray!
- A small bottle of liquid dish soap (e.g., Dawn, Joy, etc.). Safely removes any potentially poisonous chemical or toxin from an animal's fur or feathers. For example, if your pet rolled in something poisonous (like motor oil, etc.), you can safely bath it off with liquid dish soap. Also used mixed with peroxide for skunk spray!
- Epson salts Good to have for swollen paw, or interdigital cysts. Mix with warm water, and soak paw for 15 minutes or so.
- Always pre-program your cell phone with the phone numbers to your veterinarian, your emergency veterinarian, and an animal poison control center in case of emergency.
- If you are traveling with your pets, find the closest animal hospital to where you are in advance, just in case.
- Always pre-program the address of your veterinarian's office and emergency veterinarian's clinic into your phone, so you can get there immediately in case of emergency.






